Membership

A total of 232 memberships, representing 435 adult members, joined or renewed their membership with Brits Abroad Shanghai for the year ending 2015. According to our constitution, a majority of our members (60%) must be from the UK, with up to 40% from other countries. Throughout the year our UK membership has consistently run from about 63-65%, leaving us comfortably meeting this requirement. This has enabled us to meet the needs of both our UK members by providing a familiar social environment and our non-UK members by letting them experience our culture!

Within Shanghai, as of year-end, 58% of our members lived in Puxi, while 42% were in Pudong.

Over the summer we decided to move our long-standing Newcomer Coffee to the newly-opened Pret A Manger in the K11 building, Huangpu District. The new location has worked out very well, with management often offering complimentary snacks and second coffee free. Plus it has turned out to be much more accessible for most people. Social

Looking back at 12 months as Brits Abroad Social Coordinator fills me with amazement at what can be achieved by a group of volunteers. Firstly, the volunteers' dedication has been highlighted by hours spent organising and running our events and by the large amounts of money we have raised to donate to worthwhile causes in China.

Just doing a count up of the number of events that have taken place this year came as a total shock - we are at the fantastic number of 40! Not bad for a small group like Brits Abroad.



So to start our journey, we begin back in March 2015 with our Fun Quiz. As ever this was a sold-out event, with fierce competition to see who will take the crown and write/compose the following quiz. We will have gone on to do 3 more fun quiz nights before our year is over. If you have not come along yet, I would take a chance and join us for the next one.

Danielle and Siobhan, two of our members that, sadly, have left Shanghai put on a Nia class for some of our members and donated the money to our charity pot – THANK YOU.

A first for Brits Abroad, we organised a Bingo Night! Bingo cards were brought in by Sue Adam's Mum in her suitcase – well, as it was a **first** for the Brits Club, we had to have the right equipment! Then we had our very special bingo caller, Terry Sapsford, and his two lovely assistants, Ros & Sue. Fantastic night – we will be doing it again in case you missed out last time.

In May we joined forces with the British Chamber to help them celebrate their 100th anniversary. 73 of 1,000 guests were Brits Abroad members, which was a great turn out considering the size of our group. It was a brilliant night, we ate, drank and danced into the small hours.

A highlight for me was the Ascot Charity Lunch at Kathleen's Waitan. The turnout was great, amazing food and a location to die for overlooking the Pearl Tower. Pilar, the lady from the charity, gave a heart-warming speech about how she started the charity and the amazing group of children the charity is helping. Ladies, you looked great in your lovely dresses with the sun coming out to allow us to have drinks on the terrace.



Following the Ascot Lunch, we enjoyed an informative evening with the British Consulate to explain how they can help us in times of need. Plus, we had a tour around their new offices, so if we need them going forward we know where they are in our vast city.

We started the afternoon session with lunch and then moved around some great art galleries. We reintroduced SunSetters at Southern Belle, plus continued with Drop In Drinks which have visited a different location each month – well-supported by our members, always a treat to try somewhere new, catch up with old friends and meet new Brits members.

As 2015 came to a close we planned our now famous Christmas Lunch. We returned to the Four Seasons Hotel. What a lovely start to the festival season! Wonderful venue, amazing food and the musical chairs lived up to its rumours of being brutal but fun! Our members were very generous and gave wonderful new winter outfits for the charity Heart to Heart, plus all the raffle money went to the charity Stepping Stones. To complete our Christmas activities we had Drop In Drinks at Bocado. Even Mrs. Santa came along to make sure we were celebrating Christmas in style!



We kicked off 2016 with a Welcome Back Tea, then moved onto our first Around The World Lunch, Drop In Drinks and two Indian Cookery Courses and finally, to round off this year, a final Fun Quiz. Throughout the year we enjoyed our Elevens at the Waldorf. I still pinch myself each time I am sitting there in the fabulous surroundings of a very grand hotel, surrounded by a group of very special people. So that brings the current Brits Abroad year to a close, lots of great memories to look back on. PLUS, as we are celebrating our 20th Anniversary during 2016, we have a very elegant Dinner and Dance to look forward to in April. Regular Activities

Walks



This year, Brits Abroad Walks have covered far-reaching areas of interest in Shanghai, from the fascinating Old Town to the planned, then abandoned, new city centre of Wujiaochang, the Jesuit-inspired gems of Xujiahui, the treasures of the Former French Concession, the fabulous structures of the Expo Park and some lovely green spaces, including Zhongshan, Luxun, Fuxing and Century Parks. A new highlight this year was the October Walk for Life through Puxi and Pudong which saw 50 participants wearing pink t-shirts and raising awareness and funds for Breast Cancer causes.

The Walks Team was very sorry to lose Lyn Frazer when she returned home to Australia in September but pleased that Jenny Cantlay was willing to take on the role of Joint Coordinator with Jane Sutton. The current team of 6 also includes Kate Short, Jaki Madely, Natalie Miller and Jane Bullen. Walks are held monthly apart from July and August and, after each walk, the notes are added to the Brits Abroad website where they can be accessed by members.

Book Club

Book Club is a regular event on the Brits calendar, with members meeting on the third Tuesday of the month from September to June. The books are chosen in June for reading the following academic year from a selection of works proposed by our members and voted on by the whole book group. We aim to discuss a wide variety of books and this year was no exception.



In 2015 we covered an extensive range of themes and authors from across the globe, stimulating some lively debates and discussions.

Traditionally, meetings have been held in the morning at members' homes but this year we shook things up a bit and introduced two meetings a year at an outside venue. In March we held a late afternoon/early evening Book Club at Kartel Wine Bar and in June the books were discussed over afternoon tea at Sasha's. These events were highly popular and the later times opened up Book Club to a slightly different circle of readers.

In the autumn, we arranged to buy tickets for the Shanghai International Literary Festival. Members attended two of the literary lunches taking place at 'M on the Bund': "Is the Foreign Press too tough on China" and Patricia Luce Chapman's captivating talk, "Why I will never pierce my ears and other Shanghai stories". All those who attended were very enthusiastic and we hope to repeat the experience in 2016.

Book Club has been well attended in 2015 with over 20 people on our mailing list. There is regular attendance of about 8 – 11 members and it is a very friendly, inclusive event with regular attendees getting to know each other well. The transient nature of expat life in Shanghai means that we have said goodbye to several of our members over the course of the year but we have had the good fortune to have some lovely new members join us and Book Club looks to have a healthy future in 2016!

Mahjong

We had a fun 2015 at Mahjong on Monday afternoons. Conversations and laughter could be heard throughout the afternoons with many people getting to know one another much better while having fun playing the game.

We have a lot of Mahjong experts now. In contrast, there were quite a few new members and guests trying out their hand at learning the game. In fact, there were only a few weeks all year where we didn't have a beginners' table. Although the game seems complicated for the first few weeks, it is something that anybody can play so it's good to see so many people giving it a try. We had some record attendances this year and will hopefully need to buy some additional Mahjong sets in 2016 so even more people can play.

We meet every Monday afternoon at The Park Tavern. Come and join us!

May I

We meet every Wednesday afternoon at The Park Tavern for the card game that is May I. There is usually a lot of laughter and chatter throughout the game as well as the occasional pleading "May I" from many quarters. The rules are quickly learnt and beginners are made to feel very welcome, usually winning the first few hands as so many "professionals" are keen to help. For 50 RMB you also get free flow coffee, tea and soft drinks to keep you going.

We select cards to see which table we will play on and this way we get to meet new people and forge new friendships. We often meet for lunch before hand to catch up before the game begins. Come along and give May I a try.

Community Outreach 2015

Thank you to all our members who, while having fun and meeting new people, have helped to raise significant funds for our chosen charities. This year, with your help, we supported 11 charities covering a wide range of aid including dental health care provision, ultra sound scans for breast cancer diagnosis, a child's heart surgery and sponsorship for a child's cot in a hospice for one year.

There are three main sources for our funds: targeted fundraising from individual events (such as the Christmas Lunch), funds raised from regular events such as Mahjong and Walks, and ad hoc income from other areas such as Junk Your Jiao and second hand DVD donations.

Beyond these financial contributions, Brits Abroad members have also been very generous with their time this year. You have collected airline/hotel toiletries for Heart to Heart, donated unwanted winter clothing to The Renewal Centre and given new children's clothes for Heart to Heart at our 2015 Christmas Lunch. For the second year running you have also prepared and served afternoon teas for the homeless adults who visit The Renewal Centre. Some members also volunteered their time to teach English to migrant workers' children with Stepping Stones or knit clothing for the Heart to Heart bears.

Here is more information about just some of the charities we have supported this year:

In 2015 we continued our support for the dental programme run by **Shanghai United Family Hospital**. Hospital staff volunteered their time to visit and provide health education for underprivileged schools in Shanghai. With the support of Brits Abroad, our 10,000 RMB donation helped to provide dental kits to all the staff and students at the schools. In October, Breast Cancer Awareness month, Brits Abroad raised almost 27,000 RMB from two events. The first was the Breast Cancer Lunch held at Langham's and then later on in the month we held the Walk for life. These funds are supporting **Shanghai United Family Hospital**, in conjunction with funds from other sources, to provide ultra sound scans to aid breast cancer diagnosis for teachers living in Anhui province.



The Renewal Centre hosts twice-weekly drop-in sessions for Shanghai's homeless adults to take a shower and change their clothes. In addition, the centre runs a smaller residential centre providing a pathway back into employment. This year we made 2 donations; the first for 26,400 RMB which went towards three areas, namely the purchasing of medical kits, the refurbishment of the men's residential bathroom and shower and also the purchase of a new commercial grade oven. The second smaller amount of 10,000 RMB helped

towards the furnishing and decoration of a new women's dormitory.

This year, with your help, we were able to donate 36,000 RMB to **Nanjing Butterfly Home**. The home is a children's hospice and this substantial donation funded the home to provide one cot for a whole year. When some of our members visited the home last year they were overwhelmed by the care provided for these desperately sick children by the hospice staff. It was good to hear that this charity has now received full sponsorship from a large Chinese Construction company.



Heart to Heart is one of our most popular charities with our Brits Abroad members. Not only because they consistently raise funds for heart operations for children, over 900 to date, but also because they provide many opportunities for volunteers to get involved such as their knitting group and participating in play activities with the children. This year we were able to provide the funds for one child's heart surgery. For the coming year we plan to donate a comprehensive range of library books covering the official curriculum

for all the children in a disadvantaged rural school.

Notes

The deficit in 2015 is due to charity donations that were made in fiscal 2015 with funds raised in fiscal 2014. In addition, the largest fundraiser held in 2014, the Brits Ball (RMB 132K), was not held in 2015.

Internal Communications

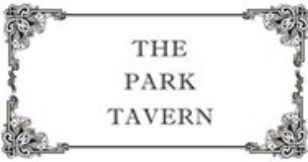
